FRESNO CHAFFEE ZOO ANNOUNCES THE EXTENSION OF ZOORASSIC PARK

Fresno Chaffee Zoo is excited to announce that the special Zoorassic Park exhibit is extended. It will not go extinct until December 31. The Zoo is celebrating the extension of this outdoor exhibit along with their re-opening after being closed for three months due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

This exhibit makes guests re-think extinct with lifelike and life-size dinosaurs that move and make sounds. The exhibit was open for a short period prior to the March 15 closure and features old favorites returning and as well as new species for this year, including T. Rex, stegosaurus, triceratops and animals from the Ice Age such as the direwolf.

Zoorassic Park is now open to the public during normal operating hours, daily from 9 a.m.-6 p.m. Once it is safe for the Zoo to run birthday parties, camps and events there will be additional opportunities in Zoorassic Park for dinosaur enthusiasts. These include dinosaur-themed birthday party packages, paleontology camps and seasonal themes in the exhibit during ZooBoo and ZooLights. Guests can also support the Zoo with the purchase of a limited time smilodon adoptan-animal on the Zoo's website.

Ticket prices are as follows and a Zoorassic Park Season Pass is also available for Fresno Chaffee Zoo Members. The pass provides all individuals covered on the membership unlimited entry to Zoorassic Park through the end of the exhibit.

• Adults (12 and up): \$5

• Children (2-11): \$4

• Babies 1 and under: Free

• Fresno Chaffee Zoo Membership Season Pass: \$36

Fresno Chaffee Zoo remains open in compliance with all state and local health requirements. Its indoor areas were closed or modified to outdoor operations following the governor's mandate to close indoor operations at zoos. As a primarily outdoor facility, the Zoo may remain open under current orders.
